

From Our Artistic Director:

By their seemingly simplistic design, bridges allow us to transport ourselves from one place to another, over terrain or obstacles that we may see as insurmountable or, to quote Lewis Carroll, "simply impassable." In their complex yet simple way, Songs invite us to do the same thing — allow our doubtful and, perhaps, even jaded spirits to be transported to another realm of understanding of the human condition.

Some prejudices that possibly are instilled in us at an early age often deepen and widen over time, making it necessary to construct "bridges" between what we know and what we don't understand. And as much as we would love these bridges magically to be dropped from the sky, building them among us takes diligence, optimism, time, and patience. Once we seek creative ways to reach out to one another and try looking at things from a different point of view, the distance and seemingly irreconcilable differences between us begin to shrink, and our world becomes a better place.

For the most part, the music you will hear in this performance expresses the joy and hope we feel when we ultimately take that journey across a "bridge" of compassion and understanding and emerge on the other side, changed by what we know and learn. The boundaries some of these songs "bridge" for us include racial, as in Michael Jackson's playful pop number "Black or White;" generational, as in the tender words of Billy Joel's "Lullabye;" geographical, as in Cole Porter's tongue-in-cheek "Don't Fence Me In;" or across that vast landscape of love and adventure, as in Frank Sinatra's iconic hit "Come Fly With Me."

Through this presentation today, I hope we encourage you to take that first step in reaching past the differences that divide us and celebrate the qualities that make us all unique.




